Burscough FC vs Squires Gate

Burscough fought back from a goal down to run out comparatively comfortable winners against a Squires Gate team that drawn with the favourites to win the North West Counties League the previous Saturday.

2-1 up at the interval, The Linnets romped into a 4-1 lead before the visitors pulled a goal back in added time. The victory lifting Burscough into the top half of the table, admittedly with only two league games played. It took only three minutes for Squires Gate to go into the lead, a thunderous shot from 20 yards giving Burscough goalkeeper Kier Barry no chance at all.

Burscough had more of the possession in the immediate period after the goal as they pressed for an equaliser but credit to the visiting defence who held out strongly, in fact they posed a threat on the counter attack that Burscough did well to deal with.

In 20 and 24 minutes Burscough went close, a curled in John McGrath free was helped over the crossbar by Squires goalkeeper Nathan Pennington then a full stretch Harvey Sample hot the crossbar. It was getting closer.

Just after the half-hour Burscough got the equaliser their pressure deserved, Harry Cannon-Noren crossed from the right and left winger Che Trapasso-Tully volleyed into the net.

Just on 40 minutes Burscough took the lead, Matty Hamilton playing a wonderful through ball to Cannon-Noren who celebrated recently signing a contract with the Linnets by calmly slotting the ball into the net to put Burscough 2-1 up. The second-half saw Burscough restore the upper hand they held for most of the previous 45 minutes.

Kian McDermott hit the post and Squires scrambled the ball away before on the hour Burscough managed to achieve a cushion by going 3-1 in front. Another terrific cross from Cannon-Noren was met by Sample, who converted via the crossbar.

Burscough had a fourth goal disallowed on 75 minutes a raised flag denying McGrath a goal his efforts deserved. The game became fairly stretched in the latter stages and only a superb intervention by James McCulloch kept out a threatening attack, then Scott Harries volleyed wide.

The Linnets worries were finally ended when Delial Brewster made it 4-1, with an excellent finish.

Hughes grabbed a late consolation for Squires Gate but that is exactly what it was a consolation. The Linnets season is up and running.

Charnock Richard Club History



In 1933 the Chorley Sunday League became the Chorley Alliance League and a Charnock Richard village team was entered, but on the outbreak of the Second World War the league and team were temporarily suspended.

At the end of the War, in 1945, the Chorley Alliance League was reformed along with Charnock Richard F.C. The team proved to be a tremendous success, eventually winning the league title in the 1947-48 season, losing only two games, and scoring 107 goals. This success prompted them to try and run two teams, but they ran into difficulties and the club closed at the end of the 1948-49 season.

In 1955, under the leadership of Ron Wilcox, the present club was reformed, and once again played in the Chorley Alliance League. In 1957 they moved to the Preston & District League, where they have spent most of their time, apart from a brief flirtation with the Bolton Combination. In the Preston & District League they were soon amongst the honours, beating English Electric in 1957-58 to take the Guildhall Cup. Success also came in this competition in seasons 1963-64, 1968-69, and more recently in 1992-93. A number of league championships have also come their way, including winning the Premier Division in 1988-89.

The 1967-68 season saw the village team take the Lancashire Amateur Shield, beating Vickers Sports Club from Barrow after a replay. Further success came in the Shield in seasons 2001-2, 2006-07, 2010-11 and 2011-12.In 1993 the club moved to the West Lancashire League, and since then both the First and Second teams have gained promotion to the top division of their respective sections.

They have also been successful in the West Lancashire League, winning the Premier Division Championship on seven occasions, in seasons 1997-98, 2003-04, 2008-09, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15. They also won the Richardson Cup in 2001-02, 2003-04, 2013-14 and again in 2014-15. Numerous other honours have also come their way over the years including two recent Goldline Trophy victories at Bolton Wanderers Reebok Stadium, the Wilf Carr Memorial Trophy in 2009, and the Northern Counties Senior Cup in 2012-13.

The Reserve team have also been amongst the honours in the West Lancashire League. Following winning the Reserve Division championship in seasons 1996-97 and 1997-98, they completed a league and Houston Cup double in 2013-14, losing only one game in the entire season. The 2013-14 season was therefore one of the best ever seasons for the club in the West Lancashire League with both the 1st Team and Reserves completing league and cup doubles..

The three senior teams are now referred to as the First team, Reserve team, and Academy team. A large number of junior teams also play in the Mid Lancs Colts Junior Football League and the Central Lancashire Junior Football League, with a youth team also playing in the Lancashire Sunday Football League

The club moved to Mossie Close in Charter Lane in 1968, after playing elsewhere in the village, and the adjoining club house was opened in 1988. A new ground has recently been developed on the opposite side of Charter Lane, known as Mossie Park, which now stages West Lancashire League games, with the new changing rooms having been opened in July 2011.

Charnock progressed to the North West Counties League in 2016-17 after finishing as runners-up in the West Lancashire League in the previous season and won promotion to the Premier Division of the NWCL in the first season when finishing runners up in Division 1. Charnock won the NWCL League Cup in 2021-22 when overcoming Cammell Laird 5-0 in the Final at Chorley's Victory Park.

A remarkable run of six consecutive victories, all away from Mossie Park at the end of the 2023-24 season, earned the club a place in the Semi-Final of the Premier Division Play-Offs. The play-off game was lost 0-1 at Gigg Lane against Bury on the 30 th April 2024.


