Burscough FC vs Charnock Richard

Burscough produced a powerful finish against top-of-the-table Charnock Richard at the Community Ground, but it was in response to going three goals down and was just too big a mountain to climb. They were finally thwarted by a superb performance by Charnock goalkeeper Ryan Hamer, who made a string of top-drawer saves in a torrid last ten minutes.

The reality was, though, that although Burscough threw the "kitchen sink" at Charnock in the latter stages and arguably were unlucky or finished poorly, going three goals down left them too much to do to rescue a point.

A habit from the last quarter of last season has unfortunately carried over into the new one for Burscough, that of starting a half in a game slowly. In this case, the first quarter hour of the second half just killed their chances against such a good team.

In fairness, the Linnets started the first half relatively well and although having his effort saved by Hamer, it was a close call to end Harvey Sample's 11th-minute opportunity with a flag. Charnock were having more of the early possession, but Burscough held firm, a 14thminute header down by Brad Carsley being scrambled away in the scariest moment for Linnets fans.

A good save by Burscough goalkeeper Kier Barry in the 28th minute preceded what would follow a minute later. A clearance bounced in front of Charnock's number eleven, Matt Davies, in the centre of the field some 40 yards from goal. He headed it down and ran on; the bounce beat another defender, and he ran on. Another touch put him through the Linnets' back line and through on goal, and he slotted the ball home. You couldn't give an assist because no other Charnock player was involved, and the visitors were 1-0 up.

The quarter-hour before the interval saw Burscough pushing Charnock back, but the score remained unaltered at the half-time whistle. Three crucial minutes took the game away from Burscough. On 56 minutes, Fenton Davies was fouled as he cut in from the left. From the ensuing penalty, new signing Dan Gray, who claims he has never missed a penalty, sent keeper Barry the wrong way for 2-0. On 59 minutes, the ball fell to Carsley 25 yards out, and he half-volleyed the ball right into the top corner for 3-0. It was a tremendous shot that was a goal the second it left his boot.

Burscough manager Dave Dempsey instantly made changes, and it made a difference as Burscough went on a serious offensive, leaving Charnock to rely on counter-attacks if they were to score again, but it also left them a good lead to sit back on. The Linnets' cause wasn't helped by being reduced to ten men for ten minutes as James Barrigan was sent to the sin bin for words spoken to a linesman on 61 minutes.

On 71 minutes, Burscough went agonisingly close. An enterprising run by substitute Che Trapasso-Tully resulted in a curling shot that went inches over the post and crossbar, with keeper Hamer well beaten. With eighteen minutes still on the clock, Burscough pulled a goal back, Sample turning the ball home after a layoff by John McGrath.

On 75 minutes, Hamer made a superb save to keep out a Matt Coughlan shot, then four minutes later made another to frustrate Sample after another good setup by McGrath. The pressure was building.

In the last ten minutes, Hamer made five more crucial saves, twice from Sample, and then went full length to palm away a McGrath goalbound effort. Added time saw another two by Hamer, saving from Trapasso-Tully and Charlie Ball from close range. The Burscough fightback had been a brave one, but Hamer put in a man-of-the-match performance between the posts at the Orrell Lane End.

A really good game of football, half of which was played in driving rain. Burscough are vastly improved on last season, Charnock Richard are not in a false position at the top and could well top Bury at the end of April.

Lower Break Club History



Lower Breck Football Club was founded in the summer of 2010 based from the Tuebrook area of Liverpool. The aim on formation was to establish a youthful group of quality, committed players capable of challenging for honours in all future competitions in the years to come.

In the clubs first season they took the South Liverpool 2010/11 Youth Division Title which was a great achievement at the first time of asking. For the 2011/12 season the club took on the challenge and step up in quality and moved to the highly respected Carlsberg West Cheshire Association Football League.

In the season that followed the club created history winning the West Cheshire League Title, The West Cheshire Youth Plate and The LCFA County Cup. History was made as no other club from the West Cheshire League had ever got their hands on the LCFA County Cup/ Treble...The club was also been nominated for Merseyside Team of the year 2011/12...Another honour in just being nominated...

Again not wanting to stand still the club for the 2012/13 season joined forces with the highly respected and fast growing Famous Grapes Football Club. The lads in there first season as a open age side became a member of the Liverpool County Premier League's 2nd Division. In keeping with tradition the lads won the 2nd Division title another remarkable achievement as this was their first year in adult football.

Not settling for just a domestic trophy the club embarked on a European Tour when they traveled over to Cologne Germany to take part in the 2013 Rheintal Trophy and in doing so brought home the winner's trophy capping another trophy led season for the lads.

Due to the financial climate the decision was made by the club committee to bring the Lower Breck name back from its hiatus (Minus The Boys from the original name) For the 2013/14 season the club played their football in the Liverpool County Premier League's 1st Division as Lower Breck FC. With hard work and dedication the club was aiming to be playing Premier League football the following season and that aim was realized when the lads clung on to the last remaining promotion spot.

With the step up to the Premier Division secured the club looked to secure their position amongst the very best the city had to offer and build a squad capable of challenging for a league title in the forthcoming years. JUNE 2015 THE CLUB GROWS

For the start of the 2015/16 season Lower Breck had grown from the one team the Moore family founded back in 2010 to the club now running five playing sides. A Reserve, Sunday and Two youth sides have all been added to the clubs roster of teams playing under the Breck Banner.

With the addition of these sides Lower Breck set their focus on growing into a strong established club and with growth on/off the field and the club pushed full steam ahead. In the 2016/17 season the Breck secured a domestic cup double winning the highly respected I-Zingari & George Mahon Cups.

In the 2017/18 season the club raised the bar even further and achieved greatness in Liverpool by winning all four competitions they played in and also going unbeaten throughout the whole campaign with a run stretching back to October 2016. LCPL,LCFA,George Mahon & I-Zinagri Cup Champions a truly remarkable feat that some massive clubs in Liverpool never managed to achieve.

Lower Breck FC have made the swift transition from Youth side to North West Counties affiliated member Club in under 10 years. Fostering realistic ambitions of FA Cup Football at Breckside Park, this Club epitomises Grass Roots development. Signing off last season with an unbeaten clean-sweep of every available Trophy was a statement of our intent.
