EARLY GOAL CRUCIAL TO LINNETS DEFEAT

BURSCOUGH 1-2 ABBEY HEY

A goal in the first minute set the tone of Burscough's game against mid-table Abbey Hey on Saturday, it gave the visitors from East Manchester a platform to base a battling performance that although the Linnets had the away goal under siege at times they couldn't recover and it arguably cost them at least a point.

Joel Ankers got the opening goal it was missed by anyone arriving a bit late for the game or anyone having an extra sip in the bar. Burscough after their rude awakening soon went close to equalising, Matty Hamilton seeing away goalkeeper Joe Lawton pull off a tremendous save then from the rebound Alfie Carmichael couldn't quite manage to level matters.

In a busy spell keeper Lawton saved Abbey Hey again on 18 minutes frustrating Callum Laird, before Lawton made a slip up but Laird couldn't capitalise on that one. Burscough were well on top now but they couldn't find that equaliser, on 33 minutes Lawton saved from Laird, then a defender bravely blocked a Carmichael effort.

Twice the Linnets went close around the 40 minute mark, first in a move that started with goalkeeper Ben Barnes and went the length of the pitch, Adam Dawson had a shot saved by Lawton before a Peter Moore effort was blocked but again Abbey Hey withstood a right old scramble. Before from a free-kick Kian bell headed wide.

When you are ploughing forward to find an equaliser you are vulnerable at the back and as the interval approached, Barnes made an excellent save to his left after a shot from 18 yards. A goal down at the interval, Burscough had had far more chances but were left rueing a slow start. Soon after the break Matt Coughlan beat two opponents only to see his shot curl agonisingly wide but Abbey Hey were still a threat on the breakaway and Dave Rigby saved Burscough with a great tackle.

On 66 minutes Burscough did suffer, now playing with the wind Abbey Hey got the ball a step or two inside the Linnets half, Jordan Barnett looked up to see Ben Barnes off his line and lifted a huge long range shot over him to make it 2-0, a nightmare scenario for the hosts.

Changes were made by Burscough including the introduction as substitute of striker Danny Boden who has been a long term injury casualty, the relentless Linnets offensive continued. After a classical move on the left Che Trapasso-Tully was the latest to suffer at the hands of keeper Lawton before he was finally beaten with just four minutes remaining, a fine build-up seeing defender Kian Bell get forward to show his attacking team mates how to do it.

As the game entered added time Abbey Hey went down to ten men as Barnett, was shown a red card, his team now under siege. Rigby has an effort cleared off the Abbey Hey goal-line, then with moments left defender Tom Dean had a header saved by Lawton who amazingly after the match wasn't given the Man of the Match award.

The early slackness by Burscough had gone all the way to the end and cost them dearly.

CHADDERTON CLUB HISTORY



Chadderton FC was originally formed in 1946 under the name of Burnley Lane Estate Juniors, who joined the Middleton Youth League and played on Parkway on the Parkway Estate. In 1947, an Open Age team was also formed and both teams moved to Mill Brow and adopted the name Millbrow Football Club. They played at the side of the canal at Mills Hill and changed at the Rose of Lancaster Pub. Later they moved to Broadway changing their name to North Chadderton Amateurs, and changed at the Chadderton Arms Pub.

The Club adopted its present name, Chadderton FC in 1957. The Club started life in the Oldham Amateur League, winning the Challenge Cup in 1954/55. The following season 1955/56, the Club joined the Manchester Amateur League and won the League Championship in their first season.

After winning the League Championship again in 1962/63, Chadderton then joined the Manchester League winning the Second Division title in their first season 1964/65 and gaining promotion to the First Division. The Club won the League's Murray Shield in 1965/66, their first season in Division One, and then the Div 1 League title in 1966/67.

1969/70 Chadderton FC won the Manchester League Gilchrist Cup During the 1970`s the Clubs only honours came in the form of the Manchester Challenge Trophy which they won in 1971/72, but failed to retain it in the following season, finishing runners-up.

Chadderton made the step into a higher grade of football in 1980 when they joined the Lancashire Combination. The Club made a good start in this league, finishing runners-up in 1981/82. In 1982, Chadderton became one of the founder members of the North West Counties Football League, following the merger of the Lancashire Combination and the Cheshire County League.

The Club gained promotion to Division One in 1989/90 after finishing third in the league, but were relegated the following season. Promotion came once again in 1992/93 but, after failing to meet ground grading requirements, were relegated in 1998/99.

Chadderton`s proudest moments have come in seeing the progression of its former players, such as former England captain David Platt, Former Leeds United and Crystal Palace player, John Pemberton and Northern Ireland International, Steve Jones. Former player Mike Ford forged a successful career in both codes of Rugby and Mark Owen of Take That also once pulled on the red shirt of Chadderton FC!

Off the field in 2007, the Club was the subject of a take-over by local businessmen Craig Halliwell and Tony Bhatti, the joint owners of The HB Property Group Limited (previously The Halliwell Bhatti Group) which is the parent company of the local property development company Hillstone Developments Limited.

The members of Chadderton voted overwhelmingly in October 2006 for the take-over to go ahead and after 10 long months the legalities were finally completed in August 2007. In August 2009 Chadderton's association with The HB Property Group Limited was terminated and Chadderton Football Club reverted to a members club run by the people for the people. In 2013 Paul Buckley, Chadderton FC Manager since December 2005 was forced to retire as the Manager due to ill health after steering the Club to a number of top 5 positions, in his time at the Club, also reaching the semi-finals of the League Cup and the Divisional Cup.

Steve Patterson and Mark Cook were appointed as Joint Managers from 2013-2014 season together with Ben Greenidge as Player/Assistant Manager and Matthew McNeill as Team Coach. The duo led Chadderton to a good run in the FA Vase in 2014/15 as well as reaching the NWCFL Division One Play-Offs in the same season where they were defeated by AFC Darwen. At the end of 2015/16 the duo stood down due to family and work commitments.

CHADDERTON CLUB HISTORY



In May 2016 ambitious Mark Howard was appointed as manager, bringing with him as his assistant Ian Hulme. Mark joined the club after a 3 year spell at Royton Town in the Manchester League, where he had achieved success including the Gilchrist Cup and an appearance in the Lancashire FA Amateur Shield Final.

In 2016/17, his first season at the club, Mark led the team to a final league position just outside the play-offs, and a narrow defeat on penalties to City of Liverpool FC in the semi-final of the Macron League Cup, scoring a club record 128 goals along the way. With a new playing surface being laid in the 2017 close season, and lots of plans for the development of the club, the future looks very bright indeed.

Season 2017/18 did not go well for Mark and Phil and parted company with Chadderton, In came David Fish and Lee Ashworth with having to put together a new team with most of the players following Mark Howard, Dave and Lee did a good job securing Chadderton to a mid-table position.

Season 2018-19 was another hard season with players coming and going it was hard to keep a settled side, Season 2019-20 well I think everyone knows about it with Covid19 putting stop to the Season finishing. It was the last we would see of Dave and Lee who were offered the job to Manage Mossley, Dave and Lee left on good terms with Chadderton and we wished them well on their new venture.

Season 2019-20 was marked null and void by the Football Association due to Covid-19. Season 2020-21 Chadderton announced their new Management Team of former players has joint Managers, Ben Greenidge, Carl Taylor, and Mark Cook. Unfortunately, 2020-21 Season was marked null and void by the Football Association due to Covid-19.

Season 2021-22 started off well for Ben/ Carl/ Mark, gaining points at the beginning of the season, then losing key players to Clubs playing in higher Leagues, started dropping points so new players had to be brought in for players that had left, started picking up points again and challenging for a top six finish only to finish a respectable mid table position.

Season 2022-23 was a good season with Chadderton challenging for a top five finish and going on to beat FC St Helens in the play-off final on penalties and promoted to the Premier League.

Season 2023-24 Chadderton were in the top six nearly season but could only finish sixth just outside the play offs. Chadderton reached the final of the Macron Cup only to lose to Barnoldswick Town.
